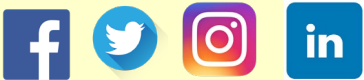

Thank you for being responsible with beach lighting. Sea turtle babies are hatching!

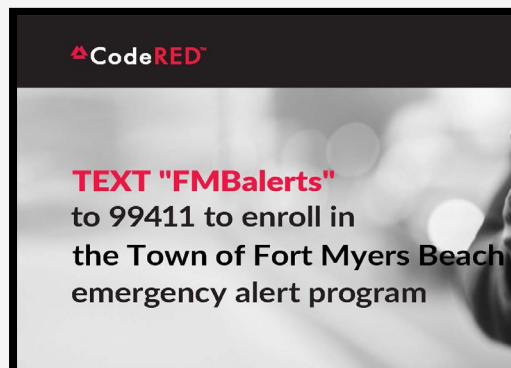
